



21st CCLC General Information

The 21st Century Community Learning Centers Grant is Federal funding that is administered by the Minnesota Department of Education. The 21st CCLC Grant funds programs for schools and community organizations that provide safe environments and activities for students during non-school hours.

The grant is awarded to schools and/or organizations located within a school district that serves students who attend low-performing schools based on State and local student performance standards in the core academic subjects, such as reading and mathematics. Therefore the programs offered to students by the grant recipients will provide students with opportunities for academic enrichment, such as tutoring and homework help, mentoring and community service opportunities.

Additional activities offered through the grant are designated to complement the regular academic programs of the participating students and can include:

- Art, Music, Drama and Recreation programs
- Technology Education Programs
- Character Building and Youth Development programs
- Drug and Violence Prevention programs

Services provided through the grant can also include literacy and related educational development to adult family members of the participating students.
